Due to time constrain, practice of conducting model examination is abandon. However, model question papers are issued to students as per university pattern. Students are found to be benefitted through this practice.

- Title of the Practice: Summer Sports Coaching Classes
- **Goal:** The aim of this practice is to provide training to the students in order to develop skill in various sports. The aim of sports coaching camp are to enable the student to;
  - Appreciate and understand the value of sports and its relationship to a healthy active life style.
  - Work to their optimize level of physical fitness.
  - Become aware to the movement as a creative medium connected to communication, expression and aesthetic appreciation.
  - Develop the motor skills which are necessary to participate successfully in a variety of physical activites.
  - Experience enjoyment and satisfaction through physical activity that develops social skill, importance of teamwork and co-operation in group activities.
  - Demonstrate a high level of interest and personal engagement showing initiative, enthusiasm and commitment.
  - Demonstrate the ability and enthusiasm to pass on to others in the community the knowledge, skills and techniques that have been team.
- The Context: It is observed that the subject sport is unattended area and need proper importance in the curriculum. In recent years it is observed that some quota in government and private sector jobs is reserved for sportsman. However students in the area are lagging behind in performance and participation in sports activity. Secondly under institutional social responsibility (ISR) college administration has decided the optimum utilisation of sport infrastructure for the benefit of students who are residing in nearby area and are not the existing students of college. These students may be called for participation in summer sports coaching classes to enhance the sports skills. These students are found to take keen interest in the activities and are ready to take admission in coming years as regular students.
- The Practice: The practice is the part of regular activities since three years. The incharge of the physical education department is asked to prepare proposal for the yearly sports summer coaching classes. The proposal usually content the duration of coaching, sports to be included, coaches availability, probable expenditure, timings, number of participants to be selected, criteria for the selection etc. After finalising and accepting the proposal a formal schedule is prepared applications are invited and students are asked to remain present on particular date. The formal inaugural programme is held, participants are introduced with their coaches and are separated in batches for various sports according to the interest of participants. They are provided regular training, suitable diet is also given and improvement in their performance is observed by their coaches. The sports like Wrestling, Boxing, ball ball-badminton Volleyball etc. are included.

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#### Evidence of Success:

- Participants are participating in district, state and national level tournaments.
- Memorizing and mental power are develop.
- Motor skills and physical fitness are enhancing.
- Socially they become more responsible by positive attitude alos helps to develops social life and academic curriculum.
- **Problems encountered:** Shortage of funds as practice is implemented free of cost. Number of sports for coaching are limited as adequate infrastructure is not available
